#### **Your Parish Council**

- The ANNUAL MEETING of the council was held in June where Cllr David Bingham was elected as Chairman and Syd Webster as Vice Chairman
- The parish council continue to financially support community facilities by giving donations to both the Village Hall and the Playing Fields to enable them to carry out some essential work. A small donation was also given to the WI to allow them to preserve a 1965 scrapbook and make 2 copies of it. This contains a lot of fascinating information about village life 50 years ago.
- We had a successful outcome of improving the drainage along Cotgarth Lane to prevent the flooding which has occurred there over recent years. Highways admitted partial liability for the flooding as a result of installing a lighting pole some years ago and so agreed to part fund the project. Other donations were obtained from both West Lindsey and the County Council, with the residents also contributing. The Lane is now better both for residents and all the people who walk it.
- Highways also upgraded the footpath on one side of Stow Road, all
  the way from the Park Road junction, round past the church and up to
  Marton Road junction. This is a vast improvement. They also
  resurfaced a section of the Stow Road footpath on the other side of
  the road.
- Highways are going to paint a white line on the footpath on the High Street, opposite the village hall as a trial, indication where cars might park, this will provide an additional 0.5m width within this pinch point hoping to prevent the road being blocked while parking at the village hall.
- A new sign has been placed at the Cemetery
- A new notice board has been placed at the bus stop and we are planning to put up another notice board near the bench & Millennium sign near the Doctors.

- The Parish council had been successful in obtaining free trees from the Woodland Trust for one of the parish fields, some suitable for wet land areas others to encourage wildlife. The Woodland Trust also provided additional hedging at the cemetery to replace the plants that had died.
- We have put together a list of contact numbers that are displayed on the Notice Board, Doctors Surgery & the Website.
