# WILLINGHAM by STOW PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER 2021

- The Parish Council is made up of 7 elected Councillors, one of whom is chosen as Chairman during the Council's Annual Meeting.
- The Parish Council represents and serves the whole community and is responsible for the services it provides following consultation with parishioners (e.g. Annual Parish Meeting/Parish Meetings etc.), it establishes policies for action and decides how money will be raised and spent on behalf of the community. It is responsible for spending the money raised lawfully and without risk and for achieving the best value for money.
- It also maintains the public footpaths within the village on behalf of Lincolnshire County Council, as well as the grassed area on the corner of Grange Lane & High Street.
- The Parish Council owns the land operated and maintained by the Playing Field Committee, and contributes to the cost of grass cutting there.
- In addition the Parish Council owns the two fields (Parish Fields) at the junction of Fillingham Road and Stone Pit Lane. The grass-keeping of these fields is put out to tender each year
- The Parish Council currently provides and maintains Willingham Cemetery (Marton Road), grass cutting in the church yard & public seating within the Parish

**Clerk:** Mrs Lisa Brooks-Sleight Email: willinghambystow.pc@sky.com <u>Garden bonfires</u>—if burned in an uncontrolled manner, may give off smoke which will annoy and be a nuisance to nearby neighbours. Smoke problems from garden bonfires can be minimised by following these simple guidance notes:

1. Compost as much garden rubbish as possible and keep any burning to a minimum.

2. Hedge clippings/other woody cuttings which are unsuitable for composting should be thoroughly dried before being burnt. 3. Do not light a bonfire if the wind is going to cause the smoke or smuts to be a nuisance to anyone.

4. Avoid lighting a fire within an hour of sunset or leaving it alight later than one hour after sunset when weather conditions often cause smoke to hang in the air.

5. Do not leave the bonfire unattended as burning conditions may change quickly with the possibility of either heavy smoke emissions or risk to the safety of nearby structures.

6. Never allow a bonfire to smoulder – extinguish it with soil or water before leaving it.

7. For safety's sake, never add household rubbish to a garden bonfire, particularly items such as aerosol cans or plastics, as explosions or acrid, chemical smoke may result.

8. Be aware of the law concerning smoke nuisance. The Environmental Protection Act 1990 gives a local authority the power to serve an Abatement Notice where it is satisfied that a nuisance has occurred, or is likely to occur or recur, which effectively prohibits further nuisance. If such an Abatement Notice is then contravened, it can result in a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale (currently £5000).

9. As an alternative to garden bonfires, there is the WLDC Garden Waste Collection Service. Or you may choose to take your garden rubbish to your local house waste recycling centre (tip). Your co-operation in avoiding nuisance from smoke and ash will, I am sure, be appreciated by all your neighbours.

#### **ST HELENS CHURCH**

In March 2020 our village church for the first time in centuries became silent. Even during wartimes there never had been, no services, no singing, no sound from the bells and no people inside. A pandemic causing us to virtually be confined to our homes. However our congregation did manage to survive by having services on zoom, dial a sermon and prayer via the telephone. Slowly over the past year restrictions have been lifted at various points and some things began to be allowed. Funerals happened with very restricted numbers initially slowly increasing but still not back to normal. 2020 was also the year where 3 village couples got married in the sight of God but lacking all but their immediate families at the event. Services have now resumed in covid style with social distancing, face coverings and sadly a lack of singing. In more recent weeks the choir have been allowed to sing in small numbers again. The bells have begun to be heard again too as the restrictions have been lifted. We have managed to keep the church open for private prayer at least once a week with a covid cleaning regime in place to manage this. At the end of November our priest in charge Rev Nicola Penn Alison moved to a new post leaving us in vacancy. We have been unable to have our usual fund raising events and our usual income from offertory collections at services, so financially with still the church to maintain it has been a difficult year. It all sounds a bit of doom and gloom but new life is on the horizon. Restrictions are being lifted !! Singing will be heard again by all and we will be able to enjoy sitting with others in church again. It will be so good to have full pews at weddings, funerals, baptisms and fully attended services with a full choir. With this in mind the church is delighted to be a part of the Willingham is Back weekend. On Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August at 6.00pm there will be a service of thanksgiving as we see the end of covid being so

#### WILLINGHAM VILLAGE HALL

The village hall after being so quiet during the months of lockdown is now starting to see our community coming back to life again. The committee successfully applied for some grant aid which enabled us to survive not receiving our usual revenue in rental charges whilst still paying our ongoing bills and maintenance costs. We have taken the opportunity whilst it has been quiet to have replaced the leaky roof of the committee room, provide retaining fencing panels to the bankside of the hall, do some decorating and exchange lighting in the kitchen and committee room to be more economical and environmentally friendly. The funding also helped with the costs of making the hall covid secure when we were able to open with restrictions in place. More recently we have managed to secure some extra funding to support the starting up of the halls community use again. We know that many groups suffered with loss of income over the past year so this is being used to support all our organisations and charitable based groups by providing the hall free of rental charges until November 2021. Please do support them in running again and let us know if we can help in any other way. The Village Hall is also supporting the Welcome Back Fun day on the playing field Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August. A day for all the community young and old to be together again in true Willingham style. There will be games, music, sport, free entertainment, free ice creams for children and a BBQ for all.
