- 1 Aug Just to let you know we have received 9 odour complaints from Willingham-By-Stow residents over the past 48 hours and in response we went to the village yesterday and again today, when we went onto Park Farm. We have not been able to substantiate that the land spreading activity at Park Farm has caused the odour and the site have advised us that due to the weather conditions they have made alternative arrangements for the waste. Instead we believe that the odour is related to sewage sludge spreading. EA

## 2018/101 St Helens Church

Email circulated prior to meeting, concerns over parking on church corner during Churches Festival being very irresponsible of the drivers. The PCC felt that double yellow lines would help the matter and asked for the PC views. Also, email requested confirmation of the responsibly of the church wall after a Quinquennial inspector visit but no concerns were raised during inspection. After discussion – clerk to reply to PCC 'the PC have raised concerns before to Highways and it's not classed as a priority to put double yellow lines plus it would be difficult to police. Clerk to report the issue of the parking on the highway's portal. And the wall is the PC responsibility to maintain which the councillors are monitoring regularly, and It was noted last year that the tree, (to the right of the main gate) might start to damage the wall with its roots. It was decided at the meeting, for the clerk to contact a tree surgeon to inspect this and get a report.

It was discussed, and the councillors volunteered to place top soil on the sucken graves over the weekend of 14<sup>th</sup> October. Clerk to contact BHT Nursery to get updated invoice & ask for the best time to order and plant the Holly.
