# Newsletter 2024

Willingham by Stow Parish Council is the first tier of Local Government for the village in West Lindsey. The Parish Council comprises of 7 councillors who are elected every four years who work for the benefit of the community and all local residents.

The Annual Council Meeting was held on 9th May - Cllr David Bingham was elected as Chair and Cllr Michael Bates as Vice.

The Parish Council represents and serves the whole community and is responsible for the services it provides following consultation with the parishioners at the Annual Parish Meeting or parishioners are welcome to attend the monthly council meetings and speak in the Public Participation section. It establishes policies for action and decides how money will be raised and spent on behalf of the community. It is responsible for spending the money lawfully, without risk and achieving the best value.

The council maintains the public footpaths within the village on behalf of Lincolnshire County Council, grass cutting in St Helens churchyard, Willingham Cemetery & public seating within the parish and owns the land operated and maintained by the Playing Field Committee, 2 fields on Stone Pit Lane, 1 currently is put to tender each year for grazing the other has been developed into a nature area for the community.

Grants last year were given to the Playing Field Committee for the grass cutting; the Village Hall Committee for the Seniors Active Fitness equipment & The Kings Coronation event; Celebration Lights at St Helens; Willingham Winter Festival to produce the flyers & the prizes for the Christmas Lights comp; and the council supported the Christmas Tree Festival at St Helens, prizes for the Best Kept Garden & Scarecrow competitions.

#### WILLINGHAM BY STOW TWINNING ASSOCIATION

Willingham by Stow has had a Twinning Association since 2000, but what are its objectives?

It aims to develop mutual understanding and awareness between people from different cultures. It helps develop values such as citizenship and tolerance and is a fun way to discover how other European people live and to make friends from different countries

We are not an exclusive group – any resident of the village can be part of our trips – young and old.

The first village to form a link with us was Moyenneville in France. The second community to become part of what is now a tri-partnership is the small town of Postrelmov in the Czech Republic. We now have good friends in both towns.

The idea of hosting a French or Czech family or staying in the home of someone you have never met can be daunting, but those who have taken part, have invariably enjoyed the experience and gained an understanding of what twinning is about. Language is rarely a problem.

In July 2010 the first three way visit was hosted in Moyenneville, France. All three countries mingled, talked, partied and enjoyed the experience of being together. An excellent programme of events and cultural opportunities was planned by our Moyenneville hosts.

In July 2011 we visited Postrelmov along with our French friends. The Czech people were welcoming to all our families and were excellent hosts. The formal signing agreement took place over the weekend along with visits to local amenities and attractions.
